 - INSPIRED
 - PRESERVED
 - PLENARY
 - INERRANT
- THE TRUMPET IS THE LORD JESUS
CHRIST AND HIS WORDS.

A BATTLE REQUIRES A GOOD SOLDIER



- “Thou therefore endure hardness, as a good soldier of Jesus Christ.

- A good soldier must be able to hear the certain sound of the Captain of the host.


- **3.** ALL MODERN VERSIONS OF THE BIBLE ARE TRANSLATED FROM THE WRONG TEXTS. THE MODERN VERSIONS PUT FORTH **“AN UNCERTAIN SOUND.”** THEY WALK TO THE BEAT OF THE WRONG DRUMMER.
- **4.** THE PRESERVED WORDS OF GOD TELL US WHERE **THE CERTAIN SOUND** MAY BE FOUND.

AN UNCERTAIN SOUND OR THE CERTAIN SOUND



- 5. WE MUST NOT LISTEN TO MAN WHO IS FILLED WITH INIQUITY, BUT TO THE TRUMPET OF GOD, WHICH IS THE VOICE OF GOD, WHICH WALKED IN THE GARDEN IN THE COOL OF THE EVENING (Gen. 3:8), WHICH IS THE CERTAIN SOUND.

The “old paths,” the “good way,” the “words of God” = the sound of the trumpet.



- Jeremiah 6:16-19 says:

THE WARNING IN “THE LITTLE APOCALYPSE”

- Isaiah 24:5
- The earth also is defiled under the inhabitants thereof; because they have transgressed the laws, changed the ordinance, broken the everlasting covenant. [the certain sound]
- “broken” = parar (*paw-rar'*) = break, dissolve, divide, cut it asunder
- And it came to pass, *that* when Jehudi had read three or four leaves, he [King Jehoiakim] cut it with the penknife, and cast *it* into the fire that *was* on the hearth, until all the roll was consumed in the fire that *was* on the hearth. **Jeremiah 36:23**

THE WARNING BY THE LORD



- “Whosoever therefore shall break one of these least commandments [the certain sound], and shall teach men so, he shall be called the least in the kingdom of heaven: but whosoever shall do and teach *them*, the same shall be called great in the kingdom of heaven.” **Matthew 5:19**
- “break = Gr. *luo* = to "loosen" (literally or figuratively):--break (up), destroy, dissolve, loose, unloose, melt, put off.

- Howbeit when he, the Spirit of truth, is come, he will guide you into all truth: for he shall not speak of himself; but whatsoever he shall hear, *that* shall he speak: and he will shew you things to come. **John 16:13**
- THE HOLY GHOST HEARS THE WORDS OF THE CARPENTER. HIS WORDS ARE CERTAIN; THAT IS, THEY ARE TRUE, PURE, PRESERVED, AND ETERNAL.

THE DEAD SEA SCROLLS



- The Scrolls can be divided into two categories - biblical and non-biblical. Fragments of every book of the Hebrew canon (Old Testament) have been discovered except for the book of Esther.
- There are now identified among the scrolls, 19 copies of **the Book of Isaiah**, 25 copies of Deuteronomy and 30 copies of the Psalms .

THE CARPENTER'S WORDS, THE CERTAIN SOUND, ARE PRESERVED, AS HE PROMISED

- Dr. Green reports:
- “Much more recently, at Qumran, two manuscripts of Isaiah have been found. One of them is complete, and dates from the 1st century before Christ. The surprising and amazing thing about this textual evidence, is that the 10th century A.D., Masoretic text is in substantial agreement with the text of Isaiah, that has been buried for two thousand years. The two texts are in amazing agreement, except for a number of minor punctuation-type variations.”

THE GREEK TEXT RECEIVED BY THE LOCAL CHURCHES

- The Greek Received Text represents over 5,000 handwritten manuscripts which the churches had “**received**” and followed from the Apostolic times to the present. Our King James Bible follows Beza’s 5th edition, 1598, with a few minor changes. Dr. F.H.A. Scrivener published his edition in 1894, which follows Beza and the few places where the King James Bible followed other editions. Therefore, Scrivener’s edition is the exact Greek text underlying our King James Bible.
- *THIS IS THE GREEK TEXT HONORED BY THE DBS.*

THE MAJOR REASON FOR CORRUPTION OF THE ORIGINAL TEXTS

- “The foremost error regarding the Person of Christ, is of course, to deny His true Deity and true Humanity. The chief means by which this was done...is technically known as “ADOPTIONISM” or “Spirit Christology.”

THE CHERISHED WORDS: FOUND IN TWO PLACES

- (1st) The cherished words are those found in the received, perfectly preserved, original words of God in the Hebrew, Aramaic, and Greek text.
- “For I have given unto **them** the words which thou gavest me; and they have received them.” [Jn. 17:8]
- (2nd) The cherished words are those found in the faithful accurate translations of the RT into other languages.
