2. Revelation, Illumination, and Inspiration in one passage

But as it is written, Eye hath not seen, nor ear heard, neither have entered into the heart of man, the things which God hath prepared for them that love him. But God hath <u>revealed</u> them unto us by his Spirit: for the Spirit searcheth all things, yea, the deep things of God. [REVELATION] For what man knoweth the things of a man, save the spirit of man which is in him? even so <u>the things of God knoweth no man, but the Spirit of God. Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the spirit which is of God; that we might know the things that are freely given to us of God. [ILLUMINATION] Which things also we speak, not in the words which man's wisdom teacheth, but which the Holy Ghost teacheth; comparing spiritual things with spiritual. [INSPIRATION]</u>

Corinthians 2:9-13 [HDW, KNOW ABOVE MEANS UNDERSTAND, SEE, BE AWARE, PERCEIVE]

3. The Cause of **Poor Illumination**

- a. Eph. 4:30, **Grieve** the Spirit
 - i. to distress; reflexively or passively, to be sad:--cause grief, grieve, be in heaviness, (be) sorrow(-ful), be (make) sorry.
 - ii. Grieving occurs when sin takes place such as:
 - 1. Anger
 - 2. Gross sin
 - 3. Licentious thoughts and desires
 - 4. Ingratitude
 - Neglect of promptings to pray, to read our Bible, to repentance, to be "dead to the world." (this is the small quiet voice

b. 1 Thess. 5:19 **Quench** the Spirit

- i. a prolonged form of an apparently primary verb; to extinguish (literally or figuratively):--go out, quench.
- ii. Quenching occurs when
 - 1. We **neglect** the **SPIRITUAL gifts** given by Him to serve the living God.
 - 2. We **neglect** the **promptings** (strong desire) placed in our heart (by the conscience, will, thoughts in the soul which emanate from the spirit of man which is quickened by the Holy Spirit.)
- 4. Illumination is **not the audible voice of God** speaking to man.
 - a. "God is able, however, to speak to the heart of man with such reality that the effect is produced <u>without</u> the need of actual words. Such is the experience of the Christian who is frequently taught by the Holy Spirit <u>the truths of God</u>, and yet the Christian would have difficulty finding words to express all that the Spirit had made known." [HDW, my emphasis] [Quote of Dr. John Walvoord, in *Hearing the Voice of God*, p. 204]
 - b. The truths of God in the quote above is the Scripture
- 5. **Illumination** is being able to understand the Scriptures
 - a. "the influence or ministry of the Holy Spirit which enables all who are in right relation with God to understand the Scriptures."
- 6. The **conscience**, our witness, which judges our thoughts and actions, is influenced by illumination.
- 7. **Intuition, hunches, and feelings** are <u>not</u> illumination.
 - a. As we learned, the conscience, which influences thought, hunches, and intuition, can be defiled, evil, seared, impure, etc.
 - b. This was the **modernist problem** (the conscience was the throne of God). (the conscience overruled the Bible).

- c. This is the **postmodernist problem**, which is simply a progression of modernist thought to **no absolute** external (to self) truth at all. (the conscience was the throne of God).
- 8. **Application** of the Words of God (doctrine) to situations is facilitated by illumination of the Words of God that comes from the Holy Spirit. Understand implies application.
 - a. This is **wisdom**.
- 9. Illumination is **the secret** of sanctified churches.
- **Lu 11:36 (KJV)** If thy whole body therefore [be] full of light, having no part dark, the whole shall be full of light, as when the bright shining of a candle doth give thee light.
- **Joh 1:9 (KJV)** [*That*] was the true Light, which lighteth every man that cometh into the world.
- **1Co 4:5 (KJV)** Therefore judge nothing before the time, until the Lord come, who both will bring to light the hidden things of darkness, and will make manifest the counsels of the hearts: and then shall every man have praise of God. [HDW, be slow in judgment because you may have a beam in your own eye and a mote (speck) may be in the eye of another]
- **Eph 1:18 (KJV)** The eyes of your understanding being enlightened; that ye may know what is the hope of his calling, and what the riches of the glory of his inheritance in the saints,
- **Eph 3:9 (KJV)** And **to make** all [*men*] **see** what [*is*] the fellowship of the mystery, which from the beginning of the world hath been hid in God, who created all things by Jesus Christ:
- **2Ti 1:10 (KJV)** But is now made manifest by the appearing of our Saviour Jesus Christ, who hath abolished death, and hath brought life and immortality to light through the gospel:
- **Heb 6:4 (KJV)** For [it is] impossible for those who were once enlightened, and have tasted of the heavenly gift, and were made partakers of the Holy Ghost,
- **Heb 10:32 (KJV)** But call to remembrance the former days, in which, after ye were illuminated, ye endured a great fight of afflictions;
- **Re 18:1 (KJV)** And after these things I saw another angel come down from heaven, having great power; and the earth was lightened with his glory.
- **Re 21:23 (KJV)** And the city had no need of the sun, neither of the moon, to shine in it: for the glory of God did lighten it, and the Lamb [is] the light thereof.

Re 22:5 (KJV) And there shall be no night there; and they need no candle, neither light of the sun; for the Lord God giveth them light: and they shall reign for ever and ever.
